

COUNCIL MEETING OF JUNE 6, 2016

The first regular June meeting of the Mannington City Council with Mayor James Taylor presiding was held Monday, June 6, 2016 at 7:00 p.m. at city hall. Council members attending were Denny Efaw, Kenneth Fletcher, Charlie Kolb, Richard Stevens and Becky Williams.

City Clerk Michele Fluharty read the minutes of the previous meeting and they stood approved as read.

Visitor Gary Leeson said something still needs done about the loud noise in Homewood caused by cars with illegal exhaust. He said he recently called the City's dispatcher center but no one responded and it was not listed in the newspaper. Mayor Taylor said the police department will keep trying to catch the violators in Homewood and other areas of town.

In department reports, Chief of Police David James said 75 citations were written during the month of May and they received 123 calls for assistance. Superintendent Ted Nice reported on the jobs his crew completed during the last two weeks. Fluharty said the new Welcome to Mannington signs for Flaggy Meadow and Buffalo Road will be installed next week. She also said the credit/debit card module will be activated this month so her office can begin taking card payments for water bills, fines, building permits, etc.

In New Business, Taylor recommended Dennis Williams for the vacancy on the Sanitary Board that was created when Charlie Hall resigned for personal reasons. Kolb made the motion to appoint Williams to fill Hall's unexpired term on the Sanitary Board. Stevens seconded the motion and it carried. Williams' term will expire on November 21, 2018.

Taylor said Richard Stevens has agreed to be the City's representative on the West August Historical Society Board of Directors. Williams made the motion to appoint Stevens as the City's rep on the WAHS Board. Kolb seconded the motion and it carried. Stevens abstained.

The outstanding bills were reviewed. Efaw made the motion to pay the outstanding bills as presented. Fletcher seconded the motion and it carried.

Taylor read a letter from Comcast advising the City that TKMI will be taken off their basic package.

Stevens said the Sanitary Board needs to check the camper that is sitting on Laurel Drive. He said it looks like someone is living there without a proper sewage connection. Taylor said it would be checked out this week.

Efaw made the motion to adjourn. Kolb seconded the motion and it carried. The meeting adjourned at 7:24 p.m.
