

COUNCIL MEETING OF MAY 16, 2016

The second regular monthly meeting of the Mannington City Council with Mayor James Taylor presiding was held Monday, May 16, 2016 at 7:00 p.m. at city hall. Council members in attendance were Denny Efaw, Kenneth Fletcher, Charlie Kolb, Richard Stevens and Becky Williams.

City Clerk Michele Fluharty read the minutes of the previous meeting and they stood approved.

There were no visitor comments.

In department reports, Street & Water Superintendent Ted Nice detailed their work during the last two weeks. He said everything is ready to begin paving, weather permitting. Kolb asked about the sidewalk by the Mannington Home Center and Nice said they could possibly cut it out to correct the problem. Chief of Police David James said he is still waiting on the Dodge cruiser repairs to be completed. Stevens said the police presence in Homewood has helped with the speeding problem. Fluharty said she has collected over \$20,000 in delinquent business & occupation taxes so far.

In New Business, General Fund Budget Revision #6 was reviewed. Fluharty said it was necessary to make adjustments before the end of the fiscal year in June. Kolb made the motion to approve Budget Revision #6. Fletcher seconded the motion and it carried.

The outstanding bills were the final item on the agenda. Efaw made the motion to pay the outstanding bills. Stevens seconded the motion and all approved.

Stevens said Council has not received copies of the Sanitary Board minutes since September. Fluharty said that was just an oversight and they will be in their folders for the next meeting.

Kolb made the motion to adjourn. Fletcher seconded the motion and it carried. The meeting adjourned at 7:12 p.m.
