

COUNCIL MEETING OF SEPTEMBER 21, 2015

The second regular September meeting of the Mannington City Council with Mayor James Taylor presiding was held Monday, September 21, 2015 at 7:00 p.m. Council members attending were Denny Efaw, Kenneth Fletcher, Richard Stevens and Becky Williams.

City Clerk Michele Fluharty read the minutes of the last regular meeting and they stood approved as read.

In department reports, Superintendent Ted Nice gave an account of their work schedule during the previous two weeks. He said they picked up the new (used) bucket truck and plan to put 200 ton of asphalt on Pyles Avenue before the weather gets bad.

Fluharty distributed the FY 2014-15 financial statements to the mayor and council. They will be published in the newspaper this week.

Visitor Randy Elliott presented pictures of various bridge signs in Mannington and throughout the County. All of the signs were green and made to the State's specifications. He said his family wants the Historic Southside Bridge sign to be exactly like the Hough Street Bridge sign. He said if the City okays the sign, Chris McIntire will send the request to the DMV along with a copy of the minutes from the May 6, 2013 during which the sign name was approved. Taylor gave Elliott a copy of the minutes and told him to proceed with ordering the green sign according to the State's standards.

The request for a donation for the water stations during the Women on Wellness Day was the first item under New Business. Williams made the motion to donate \$200 for the Women on Wellness Day. Efaw seconded the motion and it carried.

Halloween was discussed. It was agreed to hold Trick or Treat on Saturday, October 31 between the hours of 6:00 p.m. and 7:30 p.m. for children 12 years of age and under.

Mayor Taylor read letters from North Marion Girls Softball and the Robert Clark Chapter of the Vietnam Veterans Association thanking the City for the donations to their organizations.

Efaw made the motion to pay the outstanding bills. Stevens seconded the motion and it carried.

Efaw made the motion to adjourn. Williams seconded the motion and it carried. The meeting adjourned at 7:15 p.m.
